

Boats are constantly moving and the sea can be an unpredictable environment. Those with medical, heart, mobility, pregnancy or other conditions should check sea conditions before traveling and exercise caution. Guests' travel on-board Sydney Princess Cruises at their own risk.

We ask our guests to read this safety instruction sheet and exercise common sense in implementing its procedures.

- Always use the handrails on the boat in any weather conditions with particular attention around the stairs. The seats are to sit on and the rails to keep you in. Please don't sit on the rails or stand on the seats.
- If you normally suffer from seasickness take tablets prior to departure. We recommend any over the counter remedies available from your local pharmacy. If feeling unwell seek help from the crew, stay low and in the fresh air. Using the toilets will make you feel worse and others after you.
- The top deck rocks (side to side motion) more than the bottom deck due to its height. It's advised that people with little experience on the sea, poor coordination or mobility and those who suffer from sea-sickness remain on the lower deck.
- Know where your children are at all times. Do not leave your children unattended at any time whilst on the boat. Your children are your responsibility.
- The windward side (the side the wind is blowing from) of the boat is the windy and sometimes wet side.
- Smoking is permitted in the designated area of the boat only. Please do not dispose of your cigarette butts in the water, use the ashtrays provided.
- Be mindful of your rubbish, Oz Whale Watching is advanced Eco Certified and provide recycling bins for all recyclable items and general rubbish. Please use the appropriate bins whilst on-board.
- Exercise 'Common Sense' be aware not to hit your head or trip over. Watch where you are going.
- In the unlikely case of an emergency the crew will ask you to assemble at our 'Muster Station' located at the rear of the lower deck in front of the galley or at the rear of the upper deck
- The wheelhouse is the navigation centre of the boat and is a crew only area. Permission to visit is at the skippers discretion.
- Seek the crews help, they are here to help you and please report any incidents to the Cruise Director
